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

### **Humberston Cemetery**

Funerals are still taking place but only immediate family are allowed to attend for interments etc., due to the social distancing measures currently in place.

If visiting the Cemetery, please consider other visitors and users and maintain social distancing at all times.

Cemetery maintenance has continued as usual throughout the lockdown period.

### **Humberston Parish Council - Parish Council Notes**

The last meetings of the Parish Council have been held virtually via the Zoom platform, with members accessing the meeting with both audio and visual means. Members of the public have also been joining in as well as Ward Councillors. The meetings will hopefully be held normally when appropriate to do so, but in the meantime the meeting schedule has been maintained throughout these last three months through the virtual meetings.

### **Annual Meeting**

The Annual Parish Council meeting was held slightly later than usual in June with Cllr. Bailey being re-elected as Chairman of the Council, Cllr. Scoffin as Vice-Chair and also a new member joined in June with Cllr. Jane Woollock being coopted. Former member, Cllr. Robinson, has now left the Council. As of the end of June, 10 members sit on the Council and there are still 2 casual vacancies.

### Highways/Footpaths/Traffic Issues

The TRO for Humberston which will prevent parking on verges and footways has now been formally advertised by NELC and the last part of action on getting this in place is now awaited.

### Wendover Hall and Wendover Paddock Hall

Both Halls have remained closed during the lockdown period, closing from the second week in March. The old Hall reopened on 1st June just for the Wendover Preschool to return, but all other hirings are suspended until the Government guidance tells the PC it is safe to open. During the lockdown period, a deep clean has been undertaken and the new Paddock Hall has been decorated throughout internally and also external decorating has now been completed. The PC has installed hand sanitisers and notices throughout the Halls and will be putting in any necessary measures before any reopening takes place.

### <u>Planning</u>

The Parish Council continues to receive consultation on many planning applications for Humberston and these are discussed at the Parish Council main monthly meetings and also at an interim Planning Committee Meeting held mid-way through the month.

Residents are most welcome to attend and make the Parish Council aware of any issues with planning. All Planning Agendas and Minutes are all on the Parish Council website. /continued over.....

#### **Finance**

The Parish Council has had its internal audit for the financial year accounts 19/20 completed and a copy of this is on our website. The accounts have now been submitted to the external auditors, PKF Littlejohn, and the Annual Return completed and also published on our website. The public have a period for the right of inspection of the accounts and the dates for this are also on our website.

### Crime

There have been 22 reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Ward for May. There were 11 reports for Humberston.

Commercial Burglary: 1

During the evening of 25<sup>th</sup> May, a teaching block at Humberston Academy was entered via the fire door. Nothing was stolen.

Criminal Damage: 2

Damage to windows at building huts at the Old Paddock Court development. Glue put into padlocks at a premises on Wilton Road.

### **Ward Councillor Notes**

### Ward Councillor Notes June 2020

It appeared that the whole world had stopped due to the arrival of the global pandemic caused by Covid-19.

Lockdown measures were announced by the prime minister on the 23<sup>rd</sup> March and our day to day activities changed dramatically. The measures were put in place with a message to **Stay at Home, Protect the NHS and Save Lives** in order to reduce the transmission of Covid-19 and to reduce the burden on the NHS. We all look forward to a return to 'normal'.

The major change for us as ward councillors was the lack of personal contact and the cessation of committee meetings. Emergency government legislation was passed to enable Council meetings and committees to be held by teleconference and virtual remote meetings have replaced meetings traditionally held in a committee room attended by members of the public. New IT skills have had to be mastered to be able to participate. Virtual meetings have also been made available for members of the public to view, and for certain criteria, participate.

Council elections due to take place in May were cancelled and have now been deferred to next year. Formal activities such as Mayor Making were also cancelled.

The lockdown created concerns for vulnerable residents and these concerns have brought out a caring response from individuals. NELC co-ordinated a food parcel delivery for residents on a shielding list until government schemes took over or alternative food and essentials deliveries were put in place. Ward councillors participated by delivering the council parcels to the identified residents in our ward.

Volunteer groups also set up a rapid response by organising collection of food and medical supplies on behalf of shielding residents. Ward Councillors have also been calling some vulnerable residents to ensure somebody is keeping in touch.

The financial impact of the crisis is considerable, and central government have established an unprecedented package of support for individuals through the furlough scheme, and there has been considerable support for our shielded and vulnerable residents through food parcels and direct financial support.

The business community has been supported with relief on business rates and loans; and up to £25,000 of <u>Business Support Grant has helped 3,500 local</u> businesses to get through the Covid-19 emergency. For business ineligible for this grant, applications are in for a government allocated <u>Discretionary Grant Fund</u>.

During all of this, your council has managed to maintain day to day services such as refuse, recycling and garden waste collections, grass-cutting and highway repairs without interruption. Major highway projects have also progressed. Services have continued to be supported by council employees who have been working remotely. A massive thank you must go to our council staff, both backroom and frontline, who have ensured a degree of normality.

NELC has received some financial support to help with the many additional costs it has incurred, for example covering additional staff costs to offset staff self-isolating, but costs significantly exceed this support. We hope that Boris is aware of this and will be working on mechanisms that protect future local services.

There has been a community appreciation for our valued NHS and frontline workers that manifested in the weekly doorstep celebration at 8pm on Thursdays by the simple act of applauding. As ward Councillors our thanks go out to the NHS and thoughts go out to the families who have been affected by the virus. I think we all have concerns that the lockdown will be replaced by a recession and a new 'normal'. It remains to be seen how quickly the local economy can recover. Inevitably there will be business casualties, but we can all help by "thinking local" and "buying local".

That said the shoots of recovery are growing. House building has recommenced, and economic activity is returning. Retail is also returning, and I know I certainly enjoyed the simple pleasure of a bag of chips, even if the act of purchase was more complicated.

Well done to all our residents for minimising contagion by staying at home and social distancing. Whatever the short term and long-term return to normal looks like, we are here to respond to resident issues

Greetings from St Peter's Church

I wonder how the recent weeks of lockdown have been for you? COVID 19 has meant that some of us are busier than ever adapting to huge new changes at work or at home, for others the days go slowly. For many the pressure of family life in lockdown is as challenging as the isolation of living alone.

Many good things are happening: people are working hard to support their neighbours, we can show our support for key workers on the Thursday evening applause, our Parish Council is busy supporting members of the community, and at St Peter's we are always praying for the parish; our concern and prayers are especially for schools and care homes, as well as vulnerable community members, and it has been wonderful to welcome more followers to our Facebook page in recent weeks as we continue to pray for you.
