On to ward issues, you will all have experienced some problems with recycling collections in August, hopefully sorted by the time you read this. This has arisen for several reasons and a great deal of effort has been expanded in rectifying the problems. It is clear that this is an issue that residents care strongly about as your ward councillors have had more calls on this issue during the short-lived problems than the rest of the year put together.

Following extensive lobbying by your ward councillors there has been a comprehensive ongoing programme of pavement and road dressing thought the ward, mainly in Humbertson. Most residents are pleased with the results but there have been some inevitable snagging issues which have in the main resolved when reported. Don't be shy, if you have an issue relating to this matter report it to the council or contact your ward councillors.

Can we congratulate both Village Councils for the very successful village days held in July. Attendances looked to be up and everyone concerned with the organisation should be applauded. The music festival in New Waltham was a sight to behold, and despite the weather attracted huge crowds. Wel done to evervone.

I'll finish with Planning. Our ward continues to be a popular place to live and there are aways a string of potential developments, including those in situ like Wigmore Park. Not all developments are welcome though and as ward councillors we have been able to stop some unwanted developments not all of which have seen the light of day. There are three specific developments totalling nearly 400 houses that we have been successful in opposing, and in particular I would point to the work done by Cllr Hayden Dawkins on these.

Finally, I am sure you will join me in congratulating Cllr Dawkins on his promotion to a cabinet post. He has been appointed as Portfolio holder for Culture Heritage and Visitor Economy which means that all three of us are cabinet members; but we will never forget that we are still your ward councillors though and we are here to help. ### Ward Councillor Notes

Hello everyone and welcome to your ward councillors' notes for summer 2023. It's been a hectic year so far with lots of things happening within the ward which I will mention shortly. However, I would like to bring you up to date with some developments for the overall borough of North East Lincolnshire. It's been a really positive year for your administration and the borough with successful bids to central government for levelling up funds. This means that the planned redevelopment of Grimsby Town Centre is going ahead. Planning permission has been obtained and contractors are being sought. To summarise the developments for Grimsby

A new Town Centre cinema hosted by our local operator Parkway Cinema A new Market Hall under design now.

More Town Centre hospitality venues including eateries.

- A brand-new Community Diagnostic Centre taking several units within Freshney Place and operating from December 2023.
- The redevelopment of Riverhead Square as an open space and venue for events.

In addition, the Maltings on Garth Lane is being developed as on Onside Youth Zone with construction underway by the time you read this. Also, St James House is being refurbished as a new business and conference centre with work starting on a staged basis straight away. These projects when completed will increase footfall in the Town centre and make it a more attractive place for families to visit. In Cleethorpes the levelling up funding obtained will see the following

**Redevelopment of Cleethorpes Market Place** A new Iconic leisure building on Sea Road The redevelopment of Pier Gardens

These are all projects within the Cleethorpes Masterplan. On the finance front, council finances remain tight with demand and spend on Social Services, especially Childrens Services being higher than budget at present. This is not unique to NEL but a national issue and central government needs to review its posture on this matter.

#### Land Management

The Council continues its management of various sites around the village and a new contractor has been appointed for land at Carrington Gardens and Westleigh Homes with the contract being issued for the rest of the year.

#### **Other Matters**

The Council is continuing with its cemetery extension project and has been offered to purchase the land Freehold by NELC. Since the VC already owns the existing cemetery land, it has submitted an offer to NELC to purchase the land.

### Humberston & New Waltham Ward Update August 2023

#### Crime

There have been seventy two reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Ward for July. For Humberston these included:

Overnight 30<sup>th</sup> June & 1<sup>st</sup> July a shed at a property on Midfield Place was broken into by forcing locks. Property was stolen. Overnight 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> July a garage at a property on Glebe Road was entered after locks were forced. No property was taken.

Overnight 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> July an insecure car parked a driveway on Humberston Avenue was entered. Sunglasses were stolen.

There were three reports of criminal damage. Tyre paint was sprayed over a driveway on Sheraton Drive. The rubber hose connecting a caravan to a gas bottle was damaged at a static caravan on Epperstone Caravan Park. One domestic related criminal damage

Other crime include: Seventeen thefts and one make off without payment for fuel from Tesco.

Five reports of harassment.

Five assaults.

One report of sending malicious communications.

There have been nine reports of ASB.

Eight of these relate to issues being caused by a family including loud music, smoking cannabis, and the illegal riding of motorbikes.







There is a two-tier fee system in place for the Cemetery with Humberston residents paying reduced fees. Non-residents are most welcome to reserve plots in the Cemetery, but anyone who does not have a Humberston postcode will have to pay the higher fees.

The Village Council is now in negotiation with NELC to purchase extra land for a new cemetery extension. The Village Council actually owns the freehold of the land on which the Cemetery sits and so is hoping to purchase some of the adjacent land to action this extension project.

The project will be an extensive one with the Village Council looking to take a loan from the Public Works Loan Board in order to finance the initial stages of the project.

Further updates will be given through the Newsletter and our social media as well as at meetings, but it is hoped to have the extension opened during 2024.

Cemetery road repairs will be being carried out shortly by NELC.
