It is fair to say that as Ward Councillors we had a challenging 2023 and moving forward into 2024, I'm sure there will be new challenges waiting around the corner for us to try and resolve.

2023 saw Ward Councillors, fight planning applications in our ward, and successfully stop two applications; these being in Church Lane and Millennium Farm. We are currently waiting for the result of the Midfield Road Development.

For myself, 2023 was a good year as I was fortunate enough to be given the portfolio for culture, heritage and the visitor economy, something that I have grabbed with both hands. It's a privilege to be a Ward Councillor for the ward where I live, but also being given the chance to shape our future culture, heritage, and visitor economy is absolutely fantastic.

The Village Council has now had some repairs done at the Halls as required and is delighted to the see the new swings and fitness equipment being so well used. At the budget meeting to be held in January 2024 the Council set aside another sum of money for new equipment and will probably look to replace the old wooden climbing frame to the rear of the Paddock.



Humberston Budget and Village Precept

The Village Council met in January 2024 to set its budget for the coming financial year of 24/25 and also to set the precept requirement for Humberston Village.

Budget for 24/25

Admin £10,610

This incudes all office/stationery/phone expenses, membership fees for organisations which provide legal and other services to the Council, courses and training for Members and Staff, public liability insurance and audit fees each year.

Staffing £67,300

This covers 5 staff positions and includes all PAYE, pension contributions, insurances, holiday cover etc. Rates are not set by the Council but are set nationally for staff members.

Village Halls and Paddock £14,500

This includes all insurances, utility supplies such as gas/electricity/ water, business rates, repairs and maintenance, necessary licences, fire fighting and safety equipment, all cleaning materials and waste disposal.

Cemetery £44,640

Covers the annual maintenance contract which runs now until 2025, water rates, business rates, gritting and turfing and the waste disposal at the cemetery.

This figure also includes the planned cemetery extension project costs—land purchase from NELC and loan repayments for set up costs

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Allotments £3,800

Covers water rates, rental of site, competition, project and repairs etc.

Paddock £17,000

This incudes annual inspection and routine maintenance and new equipment provision in the Paddock.

Newsletter £9,000

Covers printing and distribution of Village Newsletter for four editions each year.

Events £3,000

This provides a Summer Event, a Christmas Event, Holiday Clubs during the Summer and other events put on by the Council. Some events are self funding through refreshment sales etc. and some are laid on by the Council with the Council standing the costs.

Other £14,500

This figure includes ongoing maintenance of Centenary Green, projects identified for the year—with acoustic boarding to the QE Hall included in this, roof repairs to Wendover Hall, tarmac fund savings and some works to the trees within the Cemetery and a sum included towards continued land management maintenance within the Village on sites owned by the Village Council.

Total Budget for year 2024/25 £184,350

Revenue:

During the year the Village Council brings in revenue from the Halls, the Cemetery, the allotments and also through selling of advertising

within the Humberston Newsletter. Revenue does vary each year.

Approximate revenue figures for an average year total around £30,000 to £35,000.

Setting of Precept for Humberston Village

The Precept for Humberston Village has been set at £120,000 for the coming financial year of 2024/25. This is an increase on the previous year's precept but there has been a significant increase in the number of houses in Humberston through the new building taking place.

The Precept increase is shown below with an approiximate calculation for each house banding—the figures are PER HOUSE, PER YEAR

The increase for an average Band D house will be £2.56 per year which equates to a 21 pence per month increase.

In 2008 she had the honour of making the official birthday cake for HRH The Prince of Wales, now King Charles III. The cake was twenty inches square and was a replica of the Walled Garden at Highgrove. The list goes on

Dawn is always in demand, but still found time in 2017 to produce some unique 10th. Anniversary cookies for the Humberston Happening's Last Night of the Proms Concert in November of that year.

The new draft local plan is out for consultation from NELC and its vitally important that as many people as possible engage with the consultation process. There are a number of sites within Humberston which are being proposed for development and the Village Councill will be commenting on these as it wishes to see development within the Village slowed down.

Residents can log on to www.nelincs.gov.uk and put New Local Plan in the search box at the top of the page and it will take them to the appropriate documents. Comments need to be in by 8th March 2024 but there will be a second round of consultation.

New Equipment!

We are now having an official 'start station' installed for the zip wire as the current grassy mound can get rather muddy and slippery so the new official start ramp will make the use of the zip wire much better.

The Council will also be looking to put in another piece of equipment during 2024.



The Paddock is open every day of the year apart from Christmas Day and although private hires can take place within the Halls, the Paddock itself cannot be hired and always remains open for use by the public.

PARKING IN THE PADDOCK should only be for those actually using the Paddock area or one of the Halls. The Paddock car park is not for general use so do please try not to use the car park for funerals and weddings as it prevents others from accessing the Paddock.

CEMETERY NEWS

The Village Council is just waiting for its planning permission for a change of use to come through and it will then proceed to purchase the extra land adjacent to the current cemetery site to provide a further cemetery extension.

This is a major project for the Village Council but is much needed as the Cemetery is popular with both residents and non-residents and the extra space will be required for use within the next two years or so.

The design will include a feature for commemorative/
remembrance plaques so that if you have someone you would like
