THE HUMBERSTON MENS' ASSOCIATION (1)

Now here's a thought for you. What significant events happened in 1935? The world was a much different place eighty-eight years ago and, of course, there are very few people around today who will have any clear recollection

of such distant times. Fortunately, we now have our good friend Google to help us out, so here goes.

Perhaps the most important UK event in 1935 was the Silver Jubilee of King George V, the great-grandfather of our current King Charles III. On the political side, Stanley Baldwin became Prime Minister for the third time



The government was quite busy with motoring legislation.... nothing changes does it? In 1935 compulsory driving tests were introduced, number plates were required and 30 mph speed limits were brought into built-up areas. In Oklahoma, USA the very first parking meter was installed and 1935 also saw the first use of Percy Shaw's invention"cats-eyes" on British roads.

The first ever can of beer appeared in 1935. It was a can of Kruegers Cream Ale and it was sold in Richmond, Virginia. Today around ten billion cans of beer are sold every year in the UK alone. Well, some things have changed haven't they ? Also in America, in Tupelo Mississippi, 1935 saw the birth of the King of Rock and Roll, Elvis Presley.

In the UK in the same year, legendary football manager Brian Clough was born in Middlesborough. He managed Nottingham Forest

and Derby County with great distinction before taking charge at Leeds

United for a whole 44 days. And whilst we are thinking about football, in 1935 Grimsby Town finished fifth in the First Division of the football league (equivalent to today's Premiership). Arsenal won the league that year with Manchester City in fourth, just one place above Grimsby Town. Liverpool were seventh, two places below The Mariners and Manchester United ? They were fifth in the Second Division.



Now there is one item Google will not tell you about 1935; this is the year the Humberston Mens' Association was founded. The minutes of the very

Humberston Cemetery News and Information

Details for the Cemetery are on our website at www.humberstonvillagecouncil.com but if you have any questions on purchasing a plot or organising an interment of ashes or a burial, then do please contact the Clerk, Kathy, on 07494 577661 and we will help you with any information you may need.

There is a two-tier fee system in place for the Cemetery with Humberston residents paying reduced fees. Non-residents are most welcome to reserve plots in the Cemetery, but anyone who does not have a Humberston postcode will have to pay the higher fees.

The Village Council has now secured land for a cemetery extension to the left hand side of the existing cemetery as you stand at the front gates. The project is now commencing to agree a suitable layout, agree paths and access etc. and also the Council is keen to provide a memorial garden where ashes can be scattered and then a memorial plaque mounted so that relatives have somewhere to visit. This will be part of the new cemetery extension works.

The land should be available from the Autumn of this year and it is hoped that the extension may be open and ready by Spring of 2024.
