


Planning

The Village Council continues to receive consultation on many planning applications for Humberston and these are discussed at the Village Council main monthly meetings and also at an interim Planning Committee Meeting

Residents are most welcome to attend and make the Village Council aware of any issues with planning. All Planning Agendas and Minutes are all on the Village Council website.

As part of our mid-term plan, NEL is undertaking a review and refurbishment of all fifty-three play areas within the borough. Draft proposals have been received for both Humberston and New Waltham and ward councillors have discussed with both Village Councils.

Parking enforcement continues to be a vexed issue, with many residents calling for more enforcement given the inconsiderate parking of some. Village councils have been asked to nominate hot spots and these will be given priority. The flipside of this are the complaints that ensue for those who receive a ticket. Park considerately within the law and you should be able to avoid these.

New property development continues to be a hot topic, with several developments with planning permission about to start construction, notably land across from Tollbar Academy and Strawberry Fields (land on the corner of Hewitts Avenue across from Tesco). Ward councillors will keep a close eye on these and try to ensure responsible behaviour by developers.

Anti-social behaviour and low-level drug dealing, whilst at low levels within the ward, continues to rise in some areas, notably the BMX track behind the Pavilion in New Waltham, and playing fields behind St Christopher's in Humberston. Ward councillors have worked with village councils, the police and young offenders' teams to address, and the presence of both has increased to good effect. Whilst many of the perpetrators are "tourists", some children are local, so we say to all parents -do you know where your children are -. Help to reduce this problem.

Ward Councillor Notes

Each time I am tasked with writing the ward councillors notes I make list of issues that need mentioning. For the last two years Covid has been top of the list and whilst that is true at the time of writing I feel able to sound more positive about things. The national vaccination programme has been an amazing success story to the extent that Government has felt able to lift most restrictions, and we can begin to think about living a normal life again.

Given the dour predictions made as we approached the lifting of restrictions, I am sure that all of the experts have been surprised by the fall in infection rates, against all predictions. These same experts are now rushing to justify why they always thought a reduction was likely. Really!

This demonstrates how difficult it is to be certain about anything relating to Covid 19 trends, so caution is probably the best option in the short term.

Indeed, despite the lower infection rates nationally the virus is still present in high numbers in North East Lincolnshire. Those who have yet to be vaccinated are urged to step forward and help to protect the whole community. Also whilst not mandatory, I for one will continue to wear a mask in shops or in any enclosed indoor area.

Finally, the so called Pingdemic has had a significant impact on North East Lincolnshire services with almost 25% of front-line staff self-isolating over recent weeks. Despite this, services have continued to be delivered at a high level, although it is inevitable that there have been some delays in some collections and grass cutting. Residents are asked to be patient and continue to report when collections are missed. The front-line staff will catch up, and we must all pay tribute to their persistence in difficult circumstances.

Anyway, on to other issues of interest within the ward and North East Lincolnshire generally.

Land Management

The Village Council continues to look after its sites and now has a Land Management Committee which conducts regular site visits and can respond to minor issues as they arise.

Works have been undertaken to improve the entrance to the PROW off Humberston Avenue with new fencing and removal of old barbed wire fencing which the Council inherited when it took on the site.

Also further grass cutting is now being undertaken after requests from residents and tree planting and further fencing works are set to take place in the Autumn.

Greetings from St Peter's Church

The weather improved as we went along and everyone enjoyed the refreshments, especially the home-made cakes, provided by the Village Councillors themselves.



Next year, 2022, sees 100 years of the Village Council and the Council is organising ways of marking this wonderful Centenary for the Village.

One of the projects it had in mind was to create a 'centenary green' for the village to create a nice green area, perhaps with the siting of a flag pole and a village notice board along with some seats and planting. Now we need to formally ask North East Lincs if we can 'adopt' the area and use it for the green project.
