Humberston & New Waltham Ward Update August 2022

Crime

There have been thirty two reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Ward for July. For Humberston these included:

Overnight 11th & 12th July two intruders gained entry to the bar at Lucarleys after smashing through the roof. Two gaming machines were attacked.

During the early hours of 5th July an attempt was made to force entry to a Ford Transit on the Beacholme Holiday Camp. No entry was made.

A car parked on was Blossom Avenue was written off after the front and rear windscreens were smashed, along with light clusters, and the bodywork scratched and dented all over.

Other criminal damages reported are:

Damage to a show caravan on Beacholme.

Damage to a shop window after a person is seen to kick the glass. Graffiti scratched into the brickwork of a shop on Grimsby Road.

Other crime include: Four shop thefts from Tesco. Three assaults.

There have been four reports of ASB Youth causing issues at the Gingerbread Café. Youths causing issues on in an outbuilding on Tetney Road. Issues with a homeless male at Tesco. Cars causing issues on Tesco carpark.

Along with this 2022 marks the 10th anniversary year of the reopening of the church after extensive internal repairs following the devastating fire that destroyed much of the west end of the church. 


New signs have now been erected at the Paddock to replace the old and outdated signs.

The poppies can be tie wrapped (tie wrap provided!) to lampposts outside of your home or to gates, driveway gates etc.


We hope we can sell all of the poppies and see Humberston Village proudly displaying them throughout November to mark Remembrance season.
