Elsewhere, you ward is relatively peaceful. We are working with both village councils and your local policing team to identify those priority areas that require attention. Whilst anti-social behaviour continues to be low, it is still an area of priority. Our police team would urge you to report any incidents, remember if you don't report it, it didn't happen.

We continue to address issues of nuisance parking and are working on a number of schemes to alleviate this. We would urge parents to allow their children to walk to school as far as this is safe and practical and not add to the parking issues around our schools.

Our ward continues to be popular as an area that people want to move to, and there is a seemingly unending list of new planning applications, not all of which are welcome. Your ward councillors will continue to represent your views on these.

Finally, whilst these notes are not meant to be political, there are local elections again in May. In order to vote you will need to present some form of photo ID at the polling station. Details of what qualifies will be extensively publicised, so make sure you don't lose out. After all, I am standing for re-election in May, and wouldn't want you to lose the chance to express you views!

Ward Councillor Notes

_As I sit down to write these first ward councillor notes for 2023, I think — where has January gone? I don't know about you but the years seem to whiz by with ever increasing velocity. If I'm lucky these notes will be finished before December comes around. Anyway, a belated Happy New Year to all of you.

We know this year is going to be another difficult year for us all, with high energy prices and the general cost of living increases. Whilst these are slowing down, witness the fall in petrol prices recently, it is not going to be easy. There has been help from central government in terms of fuel rebates and winter fuel bonusses which are welcome, however, they do not cover everything. Also government is honouring the triple lock on pensions, so pensioners will be getting a higher than normal increase when pensions go up in April.

It is sadly inevitable that council tax bills will increase again in the coming year, and whilst as cabinet members, we are doing everything that we can to keep this to a minimum, NEL is not immune from the same cost pressures that you are feeling. The continuing increase in demand in both adult and childrens social care make this coming year very challenging. We have a responsibility to keep our children safe, and NEL will be supporting this area with sufficient funding to meet demand and continue the journey of improvement and transformation.

North East Lincolnshire council has a number of schemes that can help you. The Council Tax Support scheme can save up to 65 % of your council tax bill for those who qualify, and there are a range of other schemes to help, including the hardship fund and some limited support for you to insulate your homes, just to name a couple of examples. Details of these schemes are available on the NEL website under "Benefits and help with Money", or you can call 01472 313131 and be directed to the appropriate service.

Humberston & New Waltham Ward Update January 2023

Crime

There have been fifty three reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Ward for December. For Humberston these included:

Domestic Burglary:

Overnight 9th & 10th December a home on Parker Road was broken into via a ground floor bedroom window. It is unknown if anything was stolen. During the early hours of 14th December two neighbouring garages at properties on St Christophers Road were entered. A garage was forcibly entered with a mountain bike being stolen from one, while the other garage was entered but it's unknown what, if anything, was stolen.

Commercial; Burglary:

During the evening of 23rd December, suspects used a sledgehammer in an attempt to enter a premises on Wilton Road Industrial Estate. The males were disturbed and made off from the scene without gaining entry.

Criminal Damage:

A tree and solar lights were damaged in a garden on Humberston Fitties. Damage was caused to a window at a property on Links Drive believed by an air weapon.

A perimeter fence was damaged at properties on Bradleys Corner.

Other crime include:

Eight shop thefts, seven from Tesco.

BUDGET AND PRECEPT INFORMATION FOR FY 23/24.

The Council met in January 2023 to set the budget for Humberston Village Council for the coming financial year 23/24 and also to set the precept for Humberston Village.

The budget and precept was agreed as follows:

Administration

£9,060.00

This includes insurances, subscriptions to outside bodies, government organisations etc., training fees for both staff and Members, mileage expenses for Members, Grant Aid given to village groups, some footway repair works, the annual audit fees, office expenses including telephone and web/technical provision and support.

<u>Staffing</u> <u>£52,000.00</u>

This covers 6 staff positions of Council Clerk, Caretakers to the Halls, Cemetery Sexton, Weekend Caretaker/holiday cover and a dedicated Litter Picker for the village. This also includes all pension and PAYE liabilities.

Village Halls and Paddock Management £16,250.00

This includes all energy costs, ie gas central heating, electricity costs, water rates, non-domestic/business rates, insurances, licences to play music in the premises, repairs and maintenance, equipment required and all cleaning materials as well as provision for commercial waste and hygiene services.

The Village Council generates revenue from several sources during the year. The above are averages based on previous year's figures:

Cemetery Income £22,000 approximately

Allotments revenue £4,600 '

There is also Ward Councillor funding given each year which is kindly given by the Ward Councillors to assist with any projects the Village Council may have undertaken.

The Village Council also reclaims its VAT each year and also receives income from events which are held. This income is either donated to charity when a fundraising event is held or is used to offset the cost of the event itself.



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

As part of the celebrations for the Coronation Weekend of His Majesty King Charles III, people are being encouraged to come together and have community picnics etc.

WHAT DOES YOUR VILLAGE COUNCIL DO???

Your Village Council is the first level of local government for Humberston residents.

The Village Council is consulted on all planning applications within Humberston, both domestic and commercial ones, and also is usually consulted on ones which are close to the Village boundary, ie where we meet New Waltham and/or Cleethorpes.

The Council has its own budget and income through the Council Tax—this is the part of your Council Tax bill which says 'parish precept' - you only pay a precept if you live in an area with a Parish or Town Council.

The Council also owns and manages Wendover Paddock and the two Village Halls there. It also owns and provides the play equipment in the Paddock and looks after all repairs etc. It also leases the land on which the Cemetery and the Allotment site sits. There are over 80 allotments on the site and the old and new extension parts of the Cemetery. There will be a further extension to the Cemetery in the coming year.

Your Village Council also owns the land around the housing at Carrington Gardens and the Westleigh Homes site off Humberston Avenue opposite the Country Club. We look after the Public Right of Way on this land and all the land on the site which isn't part of private gardens etc.

There are also two 'walkways' in Humberston which are owned and managed by the Council—Strang Walk and Postman's Walk.

Information, advice and support for young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities


It links up to other Council services like the Families First Information Service (FFIS) and wider services in our borough like sports and recreation for children.

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Village Planning Applications

And the role of your Village Council

The Village Council is a 'statutory consultee' of the local planning authority, which is NE Lincs. Council.

This means that any planning applications within Humberston, or on its borders/immediately adjacent to Humberston, are sent to the Village Council for consideration and comment.

The Village Council does NOT have the power to decide an application and only NELC can grant permissions. However, the Village Council's comments are taken into consideration when NELC decide whether to grant planning permission or not.

Should the Village Council support an application, then that comment is submitted to NELC.

Should the Village Council NOT support any application, then that application is automatically sent to the Planning Committee for consideration and decision. Usually, part from larger-scale developments, most household planning applications are decided by a Planning Officer at NELC as part of its scheme of delegation and decision making.

The Village Council can also ask, through one its Ward Cllrs., to 'call in' an application so that it is decided by the Planning Committee rather than an Officer at NELC.

Plans are always 'displayed' at meetings on our projector and a list of applications to be considered is always on the agenda.

ELECTION NEWS 2023!!!!

Some residents may already have seen the Government advertisements advising that from the elections this May, 2023, you will not be able to go and vote unless you have accepted photo ID with you.

This includes a driving licence or passport or travel pass—all have to be valid. Without the ID you will not be allowed to vote.

For those who don't have a passport or driving licence, you can obtain an official photo Voter ID card.

The theme is a "post-it note to self" as a reminder to not forget to take your photo id to the polling station. Or alternatively, if you don't have any recommended photo ID, voters can apply for a VAC (Voter Authority Certificate) either online or a paper form.

WENDOVER PADDOCK

As part of the ongoing commitment to renew, enhance and improve the facilities, another piece of equipment will be sourced for the Paddock from the new financial year in April 2023.

Also the Council has now put in place funding to resurface the whole of the car park at Wendover and works are already being assessed and quotations obtained to have this work carried out.

Planting continues along with our regular routine maintenance and the CCTV is in 24 hour operation.

The Paddock is open every day of the year apart from Christmas Day and although private hires can take place within the Halls, the Paddock itself cannot be hired and always remains open for use by the public.



If problems persist with vandalism in the Paddock, the Village Council will not hesitate to pass its CCTV footage over to the Police for action.



Do please try and remember that no dogs are allowed in the Paddock area, not even on a lead.

We keep the area dog free because of hygiene purposes so do not take your dog into the paddock.

Humberston Cemetery News and Information

Details for the Cemetery are on our website at www.humberstonvillagecouncil.com but if you have any questions on purchasing a plot or organising an interment of ashes or a burial, then do please contact the Clerk, Kathy, on 07494 577661 and we will help you with any information you may need.

There is a two-tier fee system in place for the Cemetery with Humberston residents paying reduced fees. Non-residents are most welcome to reserve plots in the Cemetery, but anyone who does not have a Humberston postcode will have to pay the higher fees.

The Village Council has now secured land for a cemetery extension to the left hand side of the existing cemetery as you stand at the front gates. The project is now commencing to agree a suitable layout, agree paths and access etc. and also the Council is keen to provide a memorial garden where ashes can be scattered and then a memorial plaque mounted so that relatives have somewhere to visit. This will be part of the new cemetery extension works.

The land should be available from the Autumn of this year and it is hoped that the extension may be open and ready by Spring of 2024.
