

The Council now has wi-fi at the Halls and this is now being used for Council meetings. A projector is also now being used for planning consultations and for displaying the agenda at the meeting. This fits with the Council's green agenda to cut down on paper usage. Wifi is available for hall users on request and covers both Halls.

#### Highways/Footpaths/Traffic Issues

The Village Council meets everv quarter with NELC to discuss highways matters and also works closely with Ward Cllrs. to assist with any issues which may arise. The VC isn't responsible for enforcement for parking issues though, that is NELC Civil Parking Enforcement Team.

#### Ward Councillor Notes

The NELC Council Elections are over for the year 2022 and the political parties can look forward to doing it all again next year. This is because NELC electoral system elects one third of the local councillors every year for 3 years and hold no elections in the 4th year.

Cllr Stephen Harness was re-elected to serve Humberston and New Waltham once again and the Conservative administration remains in control of the council.

The election campaigning process did acutely identify to us the increase in the numbers of properties and residents in our ward due to the numerous building developments that are building out. The ward was already geographically large, but within that geography we now number almost 10,000 residents.

We apologise that we were not able to talk to residents as much as we would have liked on the campaign trail but the logistics of the leaflet drop and the postal voters letter were time consuming, with many miles walked. This left little time to do anything else apart from walk and post. We also devoted time to do the same in other wards.

Congratulations to her Majesty for achieving 70 years as our monarch. As I understand it there will be a four-day bank holiday weekend from Thursday 2nd June to Sunday 5th June 2022, meaning Brits will be given time off work to celebrate the Queen's 70 years of service. #### Humberston & New Waltham Ward Update May 2022

#### Crime

There have been forty nine reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Ward for April. For Humberston these included:

Between 1<sup>st</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> April a new build home was entered on The Rowans where a considerable amount of damage was caused.

On 26<sup>th</sup> April car keys were stolen from behind the bar of the Coach House pub. The keys were used to steal the owner's car from the carpark. At the same time, two push bikes belonging to customers were also stolen. On 27<sup>th</sup> April, the Tesco petrol station kiosk was entered. Once inside, the secure cabinet was accessed and alcohol, perfume and other goods were placed in carrier bags and removed from the store.

Other crime include:

Thirteen assaults.

Eight shop thefts and one make off without payment for petrol from Tesco.

Two minor public order offences.

An outboard motor was stolen from the Humber mouth Yacht Club.

There have been four reports of ASB.

Youths ringing doorbells and running away on Glebe Road x2. Two neighbour disputes.


