HUMBERSTON VILLAGE COUNCIL— COUNCIL NOTES

The last meetings of the Village Council have been held virtually via the Zoom platform, with members accessing the meeting with both audio and visual means. Members of the public have also been joining in as well as Ward Councillors. The meetings will hopefully be held normally when appropriate to do so, but in the meantime the meeting schedule has been maintained throughout the last few months to maintain the business of the Council.

New Member

A new member, Cllr. Mark Leveridge, has been coopted which now brings the Council back up to its full number of 12.

Highways/Footpaths/Traffic Issues

The TRO for Humberston which prevents parking on verges and footways is now a legally active Order and enforcement is in place and is being carried out.

Wendover Hall and Wendover Paddock Hall

The Halls had been opened again and themajority of hirings had recommenced, but lockdown for November at the time of going to press was in force and so the Halls had had to be closed once again to all but the Wendover Preschool, which was allowed to continue. It is hoped that the Halls can open again in December in the run up to the Festive Period and then pick up again in January 2021. Parties and family celebrations have not been allowed since March 2020. The buildings are Covid-19 secure with all necessary precautions put in place and they are registered with Track and Trace and carry the necessary QR codes for check ins.

<u>Planning</u>

The Village Council continues to receive consultation on many planning applications for Humberston and these are discussed at the Village Council main monthly meetings and also at an interim Planning Committee Meeting held mid-way through the month.

Residents are most welcome to attend and make the Village Council aware of any issues with planning. All Planning Agendas and Minutes are all on the Village Council website.

Wendover Paddock

During the lockdown for November, playgrounds were allowed to remain open and so the paddock has been opened each day as usual. The Council has commissioned a large wooden storage facility in the paddock which will be used for storage and also the new fitness equipment for use by older residents, the air strider, is now in place.

Finance

The external audit has been completed for the financial year 19/20 with no actions recommended by the external auditors. All paperwork connected with the audit is on the Village Council's website pages.

The Council will hold its budget meeting in January 2021 to set the budget for the financial year 21/22.

Main monthly meetings of the Council are always held on the first calendar Wednesday of each month at 7.15 pm. There is also an extra meeting night on the third calendar Wednesday of each month which is held mostly for planning applications, although other business is also discussed if required.

Local Community News

Humberston & New Waltham Ward Update November 2020

There have been 35 reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Ward for October. There were 20 reports for Humberston. These include:

Domestic Burglary:

During the late evening of 27th October two males went to an address on Queen Elizabeth Road. They spent a considerable amount of time round the back trying windows and doors before leaving the area without gaining entry.

Commercial Burglary:

Over the evening of 20th October a kitchen at a residential home on Humberston Avenue was entered. Property belonging to staff was stolen.

Other crimes include:

A male has been charged with possession of a bladed article following an incident at Tesco.

A male was given a cannabis warning after being found on Paul Crescent with a small amount of cannabis in his car.

Four shop thefts, two from Tesco, one each from Pound Stretchers and the Spar. Three assaults.

Two minor public order offences.

Four offences of sending inappropriate material over social media. Three theft of cycles one each from Thorpe Park, McColl's and Wilton Road

There have been five reports of ASB:

Youths banging on the windows of Wendover Hall whilst a class was ongoing. Noise complaint about builders playing loud music. Youths on Kings Road throwing objects at cars. Fireworks being set off from the beach at Humberston Fitties. One neighbour dispute.



As I write these ward councillor notes, the UK has just imposed a one-month lockdown with the closure of non-essential retail, hospitality, leisure, and entertainment venues to combat the spread of the Covid-19 virus second wave. The government have extended the furlough job retention scheme to 31/3/21 to protect employment and further business support has been made available.

...is just as important now as it was earlier in the year and will continue to be beyond the completion of the lockdown on the 2^{nd} December.

Footpath and Verge Parking TRO

The Footpath and Verge Parking Traffic Regulation Order is now in force in Humberston as of 28/10/20. Vehicles parking on verges can now expect to receive a civil parking enforcement ticket. The exception to this relates to highways that have been deemed to be exempt from the TRO as identified by the Humberston Village Council after a local consultation. Signage has been positioned to identify the highways within the TRO and separate signage to identify exempt highways.

On the subject of 'Parking Enforcement', Humberston residents should be careful when parking in a private car park that has a ticket machine. Parking without a ticket can result in enforcement via automated photographic evidence. Having appealed an enforcement Ticket on behalf of a Humberston resident and failed to overturn the enforcement, I urge residents to be aware that they are expected to purchase parking time via a mobile phone if the machine(s) are not working for any reason. Good will does not exist.

Recycling

Over 70,000 properties within NELC have now received the new recycling wheelie bins. This has already resulted in a welcome increase in the recycling quantity and a welcome reduction in escaped recycling materials littering the footpaths and highways.


Congratulations to NELC Environmental Services teams for winning a national award for the service they provide. This recognises the improvement in the waste service and street cleansing etc.



NEW POLLING STATION FOR HUMBERSTON

The Wendover Paddock Hall will now be used as a new Polling Station at Humberston and has already been reserved for the Police and Crime Commissioner Elections in May 2021.

Unfortunately elections were cancelled in May of this year due to the Covid restrictions but NELC has accepted the venue as a suitable polling station and it does provide all accessibility requirements for those using the Hall.

When residents receive their polling cards etc. it will advise them which Polling Station to use in Humberston.

GENERAL NEWS AND IMPROVEMENT UPDATES

During recent restrictions and lockdowns the Village Council has remained as busy as ever.

There are a number of programmes it has worked hard this year to deliver and these have included:

- New path at Wendover Paddock Hall to assist with Covid-secure one way systems in and out of the Hall—new path leads from the steps down to join in the existing front path for safety.
- Lighting improvements in the Paddock
- New Cemetery Gates
- Resurfacing of long path at Cemetery which was beginning to fall into disrepair
- The appointment of a Cemetery Sexton to assist with visitors and funerals etc.
- Removal of some diseased trees at the Cemetery and formation of replacement planting programme

St.Peter's Parish Church, Humberston

Greetings from St Peter's Church

Who would have believed what has happened this year. Because of the pandemic St. Peter's was told to close in March 2020 but with Rev. Louise Vincer's lead a plan was agreed, a phone hub to all of our congregation set up and online services developed which have continued since which has enabled us to keep in touch with the congregation and outwards into the community.

Unfortunately Rev. Louise resigned and left St. Peter's in July to join her husband who was appointed to a post at Canterbury Cathedral. The majority of the congregation had the opportunity to give her a good socially distanced send off in person outside St. Peter's Church with many gifts and cards the day before she moved. She will be sorely missed.

When the first lockdown ended St. Peter's Church was professionally deep -cleaned and was able to open for private prayer every Sunday from the end of August. The church re-opened on the 27th September for communion services on the 2nd and 4th Sunday each month but with a very much reduced capacity to conform to Covid 19 restrictions and people wishing to attend have had to ring Sue Sinclair on 01472 561968 to put their names down on a list in the week before the communion. We were just getting used to the resumption of communion services when England was told that everyone had to go into a second lockdown until December 2nd. Discussions were ongoing about the provision of Christmas Services just before this and because of the massive increase in Covid 19 infections being experienced in the area we do not know what will happen at this moment in time. We will endeavour to keep the community up to date via social media, Facebook and on our website. We will also put notices up on our notice board outside the church when we plan to open the church up again, as soon as it is safe to do so.

We have just heard that a successful vaccination against Covid 19 is undergoing final safety checks and it may be rolled out in the near future. It is our hope that it will enable us to get back to a near normal as possible, as quickly as possible, and give us the ability to open our doors and invite everyone into the Church once more.
