

I receive frequent seemingly genuine emails reminding me to renew my virus checker. Phone calls to tell me my internet is going to cut off. Phone calls persuading me to reveal my bank details. Emails to tell me I have won a prize. What a sad world. The latest text coincided with an expected delivery. The text requested me to pay a fee to allow the parcel to be delivered. I was tempted to respond but instead I was able to track the genuine parcel and ignore the text message that was demanding credit card details via a scam. Million pounds are now being scammed from us every day and new, creative ways of scamming are being thought all the time. Let us all be **vigilant** and put these evil people out of business.

As I write, to honour our fallen the nation has once again observed the two minutes silence on Remembrance Sunday, as well as on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month.

This year two ward councillors were on duty at the Cleethorpes Remembrance Day Service and Parade, and I attended the New Waltham Remembrance Service. Our wreaths were laid at both locations.

Council business prevented our attendance at the ABP Humber's Remembrance Day Memorial Service at the lock gates on the 11th but we did observe the two minutes silence on the steps of the Grimsby Town Hall. I congratulate the bus driver who delayed his bus departure to allow the two minutes to be observed in silence. A wonderful gesture.

It is to be remembered that Covid-19 had caused the cancellation of 2020 services, so this year the services were an important indication of a return to 'normal'.

Covid-19

Again as I write it has been announced that the vaccination booster programme has been extended to the 40 to 49 year old groups and 16 to 17 year olds will get a second injection. Despite a degree of hesitancy, the vaccine development and roll-out has been a modern day miracle that has challenged the spread of the virus and prevented many deaths, not forgetting that one death from this horrible virus was one too many.

The latest government advice is...Coronavirus remains a serious health risk. You should stay cautious to help protect yourself and others.

Let fresh air in. Meeting outdoors is safer. Wear a face covering in crowded and enclosed spaces where you come into contact with people you do not normally meet.

Works have been ongoing on all sites with the Autumn cut of the whole site off Humberston Avenue being completed in November. The Council has also reviewed the contract going forward for this site and further grass cutting will be included in response to requests from residents. Bulbs have also now been purchased and will be planted at various locations on Council sites to enhance current planting.

Humberston & New Waltham Ward Update November 2021

Crime

There have been 39 reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Ward for October. For Humberston these included:

Between 18th & 21st October a shed at a property on Midfield Road was entered after the padlock was forced. Three bikes were stolen. During the early

hours of 21st October an outbuilding at an address on Čomme Court was entered after the lock was forced. An alarm activated disturbing the intruder who left empty handed.

Overnight 13th & 14th October a Fiat 500 car was stolen from its driveway on Humberston Avenue.

Other crime include:

Following execution of a warrant under the Misuse of Drugs Act at an address on The Rowans, a female was given a cannabis warning after a small amount of cannabis was found. Four assaults.

One minor public order offence.

One offence of making malicious communications. Two shop thefts from Tesco.

There has been one report of ASB. Three youths causing issues on Humberston Avenue.



Humberston Cemetery News and Information

The Cemetery has remained open all through the pandemic to enable funerals to take place and visitors have continued to come along as usual. There are no restrictions in place at the Cemetery at the moment and opening times are the same as those shown on the Cemetery Road gates etc.

Cemetery Improvements:

As well as the new gates installed earlier this year, and the new path to the right hand side of the old part of the Cemetery, the Village Council is continuing with its programme of enhancing the area.

Two more of the large, very old, trees will be removed over the Winter along the main carriage drive within the Cemetery and eventually all of these large trees will be replaced with more appropriate planting to give more light and colour into the site.

There will be some more bulbs also introduced this Spring to further enhance the site.

Future Plans:

The Council will be approaching NELC to ask for more land to the side of the existing site to further extend the Cemetery. Also, the Village Council have discussed the possibility of a memorial wall, somewhere where plaques could be put up in commemoration where ashes are scattered or where no formal headstone is required. This is being looked at as a possible future project but is not yet definite.

Feedback on the Cemetery is always welcomed and if you have any comments or suggestions please let us know.

Humberston Centenary Green Project

Next year, 2022, sees 100 years of the Village Council and the Council is organising ways of marking this wonderful Centenary for the Village.

A project which has now been proposed to NELC is the renting of a site close to the roundabout at the Country Park/North Sea Lane/ Grimsby Road junction which the Council, in principle, has agreed is suitable for such a project.

The land is currently an open green space with a bench and the Village Council is proposing to take over this site and enhance it and turn it into a relaxing and pleasant community space to meet, sit and relax and watch the world go by.

There will hopefully be some special centenary planting, some trees and more benches and also a community notice board on the site, should NELC agree that the Village Council can carry out this work.

A final decision is awaited from NELC during the second week in December 2021 and if given the go ahead, the project will be commenced in very early 2022 ready for the Centenary in the Spring.



Further updates will be in the next Newsletter and also on our social media pages and on our website. The Christmas tree for the Village has once again been purchased by the Village Council, with a very generous donation of £100 towards the cost of the tree from Stevensons Garage, Cleethorpes.

The lights are owned by the Village Council but are kindly put up for us each year by McCanns Grimsby who do this task for us free of charge, so a big thank you to them and everyone else who helps us get

the tree up every year.

Scouting in your community

My name is Kayley and I am the Group Scout Leader (GSL) AT 1st New Waltham Scout Group. Our group covers a wide catchment area and so we have young people attending from many different communities, which we think is just great for our young people to make new friends.

It is true to say that recent events, have brought about the need for many changes, some positive and some less so. In 2020, we began the year with 66 young people attending across all sessions, these being Beavers, Cubs and Scouts. March 2020 saw us enter 'Red status' which meant an end to all faceto-face scouting, however in true Scouting style, we adapted and rose to the challenge of embracing the world of virtual scouting. Our sections continued to meet weekly over Zoom, and with slight tweaks to the programme, were able to continue learning new skills, meeting with friends and having fun. Our members were also supported by the Scouts Badges at Home Programme, which meant that our young people were able to continue to earn badges while evidencing new skills and activities at home. In January 2021 our Census reported 44 young people across all sessions. We understand that virtual scouting isn't for everyone, and we did anticipate a drop in numbers. Despite this, we felt very lucky as a group. We are aware that not all groups were able to meet virtually, so we carried on. April 2021 saw 1st New Waltham's first ever Virtual Camp, where we met online for preparing and cooking lunch, activities, camp/ den preparation, smores and our campfire sing song, and then again, the next day for breakfast do-noughts, and more activities. It was a great success, which also saw members from other groups in the district joining us.

April 2021 saw the Scouting movement return to more face-to-face activities, albeit with many precautions and risk assessments in place. We began to receive and influx of joining enquiries and at the end of May, closed our want to join list, as it was full and we were able to see that Beavers and Cubs were not likely to have spaces until September 2022. Since then, we made the decision to increase our section numbers to accommodate spaces for more young people to join us, which is a huge testament to our current leaders.
