

Ward Councillor Notes

As we approach the festive season we are all aware of the challenges that have arrived this year. There is uncertainty before us as autumn leads us into winter. The war in Ukraine has amplified inflationary pressures and fears of a global recession. These are difficult times for a local council such as NELC to operate but our burdens are dwarfed by the day to day struggles of the Ukrainian people.

The sad death of Queen Elizabeth 11 has heralded a new chapter in the history of the United Kingdom with a new sovereign, King Charles 111. It has also laid bare the fact that many families have difficult relationships.

It was good to see the Last Night of the Proms return to the Starlight Suite in the Cleethorpes Pearl Entertainment Centre on North Sea Lane on the 22nd October and the return of the Lincolnshire Hospital's Band. A big "well done" to "Humberston Happening" group who organise the event each year. The charity event raises money for the hydrotherapy pool at Humberston Park Special School. The event has raised a significant amount of money over the years for the purpose built hydrotherapy pool that has tracking hoists to assist pupils with severe physical needs, in and out of the pool. Hydrotherapy is a water based treatment where the warm water relaxes tight muscle groups and eases stiff joints. At a time when energy costs are difficult for us all, heating the hydrotherapy pool is a challenge for the school.

Remembrance Day Sunday, falling on the 13th November, will have seen the ward councillors attending services in our ward, Cleethorpes and at *the ABP Humber's Remembrance Day Memorial Service* on the 11th. It is sad to reflect as we remember two world wars, that we still have conflict within Europe today and unimaginable suffering. Parish Council notes continued....



Humberston Centenary Green Project

WENDOVER PADDOCK

The new roundabout has now been installed. This is a fully accessible roundabout and is proving very popular.

The Council has the chance for some extra funding in the near future and so is looking to replace the swings on the Paddock.

The old bench which had been situated on what is now the Centenary Green, has been relocated to the Paddock and is being refurbished. Quite a few residents asked us to save the bench and so the VC was happy to relocate it to the Paddock where it will be well used.



If problems persist with vandalism in the Paddock, the Village Council will not hesitate to pass its CCTV footage over to the Police for action. The Village Council members have been working hard to enhance the Paddock area in general and new signs have been put up and extra planting by the side of the Halls etc.

A fence was put up b etween the Paddock Hall and the shed but this was completely vandalised along with tiles being taken off the Hall roof and smashed.

This is a shame when the Council can see via its CCTV that it is being done by youngsters visiting the Paddock.

Anti Vandal paint has now been applied to the shed and we hope this will stop the problem.
