

Humberston Parish Council - Parish Council Notes

The last meetings of the Parish Council were held at the old Wendover Hall, in the meeting room. Meetings were held in December 2019, with a planning meeting also needing to be held just before the Christmas Break, January 2020 and February 2020—with January seeing a special mid-month planning and budget meeting to set the budget and precept for the coming financial year for Humberston Village.

Highways/Footpaths/Traffic Issues

The consultation over the proposed TRO for Humberston has now been done and the Parish Council had a meeting schedule for early March to discuss the feedback and outcomes with NELC and the next phase of action. Other highways issues included the consideration of an extra waste bin for Stephen Crescent and an approach is being made to NELC to see if an extra one could be provided.

Wendover Hall and Wendover Paddock Hall

Both Halls continue to be extremely busy and the coming financial year will see a programme of works for both halls, with complete redecoration throughout in the Paddock Hall and a refurbishment of the toilet facilities at old Wendover Hall. The new windows are now in place in the Old Hall which completes the project started during 2019.

<u>Planning</u>

The Parish Council continues to receive consultation on many planning applications for Humberston and these are discussed at the Parish Council main monthly meetings and also at an interim Planning Committee Meeting held mid-way through the month.

Residents are most welcome to attend and make the Parish Council aware of any issues with planning. All Planning Agendas and Minutes are all on the Parish Council website.

<u>Events</u>

The Parish Council has its upcoming VE day event on Friday 8th May, has fixed its Summer Event for Saturday 18th July and its Christmas Event for Saturday 5th December 2020. Details will follow as usual in detail before each event.

Local Community News

Humberston & New Waltham Ward Update February 2020

Crime

There have been 48 reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Ward for January. There were 33 reports for Humberston, of which 12 were at the Tesco store.

Domestic Burglary: 1

Between 27th & 30th January a home on Midfield Road was broken into by smashing a UPVC door. Jewellery was stolen.

Commercial Burglary: 2

Between 9th & 15th January a compound on the Wilton Road Industrial Estate was entered after the perimeter fence was cut. A storage container was broken into and a large quantity of cable was stolen.

During the early hours of 25th January a male entered the Tesco store. He gained entry to the closed mobile phone kiosk and attempted to steal phones on display. When this failed he attempted to remove a TV. The male left the store and returned a short time later stealing a TV. This male has been charged with these offences.

Criminal Damage: 2

On two occasions over 10th & 11th January a male has attended the Tetney Car Sales and caused damage to 12 vehicles by scratching the bodywork or puncturing tyres.

A car parked on Fieldhouse road had damage caused to the roof by using an implement to scratch the bodywork.

Two damages were caused by residents of a home on Humberston Avenue.

Two damages were reported at Tesco.

Other crimes include:

Ten shop thefts, two from Spar, the remainder from Tesco. Five assaults.

There have been five reports of ASB: Tesco cars driving dangerously on the carpark x2. Tesco male begging outside the store. Tesco YCA throwing items at security. Police News continued

Ward Councillor Notes

Ward Councillor Notes Jan 2020

Wishing everybody a belated Happy New Year.

The run up to Christmas proved to be a very busy time for your ward councillors because we had the unusual event of a General Election in December as you are all aware. The previous December General Election was on the 7th December 1923 won by the Labour Party. Campaigning at this time of the year is not to be recommended but your ward councillors were active in both the Cleethorpes and Grimsby campaigns, walking many miles, meeting many people and supporting the election of two Conservative Members of Parliament to represent Cleethorpes and Grimsby in what turned out to be a resounding Conservative General Election victory.

The result aside, our prime responsibility remains to respond to resident issues within our ward and represent all of the electorate.

One issue that was resolved late in 2019 was the installation of a Toucan Crossing on the northern leg of the Toll Bar roundabout. NELC installed the traffic light-controlled crossing after the brakes were applied to a £2.1milion plan to scrap the roundabout entirely and erect traffic lights. The Toucan Crossing is performing well. Although not in Humberston, the Toucan Crossing being in New Waltham, the issue does illustrate the determination of the ward councillors to support and listen to the residents. Cllr John Fenty displayed his usual tenacity throughout this issue, ably supported by Cllr Shreeve, and of course myself, Cllr Stephen Harness.

<u>Planning</u>

There are no new major planning applications to report. However we are closely following the progress of the Cyden Homes planning application for 225 properties on the land east of Midfield Road and working with both the developer and residents to resolve certain issues such as highway concerns. This planning application will eventually be considered by the NELC Planning Committee due to the sheer number of resident objections to the development recorded on the NELC Planning Portal. Footpath and Verge Parking TRO

Ward Councillors are actively supporting the Humberston Parish Council as the Footpath and Verge Parking TRO approaches becoming a reality for Humberston. The parish have identified the highways that they wish to exempt from the TRO and a resident consultation process has been processed by NELC.

Not related to the TRO but of great importance are the other parking issues that are to be resolved. These include the future parking regime for the public car park adjacent to the 'Gingerbread', parking issues on the highways adjacent to the Gingerbread and St Christopher's Road at school times, especially in the afternoon. As we all know parking issues are very difficult to resolve without receiving the wrath of either resident or motorist. I therefore urge the latter to demonstrate the upmost consideration for residents when parking near to our schools.

Crime. Humberston and New Waltham remains a very desirable ward to live in with a low level of crime. However residents should remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity immediately. Our local police team of PC Dave Cave and PCSO Scott continue to do a magnificent job and deserve our full support to make Humberston an even better place to live.

Flooding Sadly two Humberston Fitties chalets flooded as a result of the heavy rainfall event before Christmas, and two is two, too many. Keeping the waterways clear within the Humberston Fitties requires ongoing attention.

The highway flooding in Grimsby Road close to the North Sea Lane/Church Avenue/Grimsby Road roundabout has been identified as root growth in the local drains. Hopefully this to be resolved by the NELC Drainage Team who have promised remedial work.

St.Peter's Parish Church, Humberston

Do I have to believe in God to go to church?

In church services we worship God through prayers and hymns. We offer God our hopes and fears in prayers and silence. We listen to what God might be saying to us in bible readings and sermons. And in services of Holy Communion we share bread and wine to remember Jesus's death and resurrection. After the Sunday service at St Peter's at 11am we serve refreshments so people can meet each other informally.

Each one of us is different, made by God. People get together to do this because we can encourage each other in our journey through life and because in a Christian church we believe that Jesus shows us what God is really like and how God wants us to live.
